School Safety: Prevention Strategies that Work

How can we ensure a safe school environment? This workshop, based on Sack's successful model, teaches substantive strategies that really do work. *(For parents and other caregivers, educators, administrators, and key community leaders, including law enforcement)*

Developing Effective Chemical Abuse Policies

This workshop emphasizes a team approach to reducing student experimentation with addictive substances. The role of each stakeholder will be identified and clarified. A holistic approach to end the "blame game" will be emphasized to unite all involved in this lifesaving effort. *(For parents and other caregivers, educators, and key community leaders, including law enforcement)*

Confronting Bullying: An Approach to Zero Tolerance

This workshop outlines one administrator's strategy for ending student to student threats, harassment and bullying with 99 percent success. *(For educators and administrators)*

Simple Solutions to Complex Problems

This workshop identifies substantive strategies to eradicate participation in risky behaviors that really *do* work. It dispels the myth that there is a simple "quick fix." *(For parents and other caregivers and educators)*

Substance Abuse: Taking a Stand - Ending Denial

This workshop offers strategies that will result in increased awareness about substance abuse as a community wide issue with the goal of reducing use among young people. Emphasizes the importance of adopting an open and honest approach that will garner the support of the community. *(For parents and other caregivers, educators and key community leaders, including law enforcement)*

What's Wrong with Kids Today?

This workshop examines societal factors influencing youth and notions among adults that their kids are so different than past generations. Maybe students *aren't* so different. Perhaps the world around them is what's really changed. Once this hypothesis is accepted we are free to begin to identify solutions that will save our young people's lives. *(For parents and other caregivers and educators)*
